President Nelson Mandela of South Africa (July 18, 1918-December 5, 2013) will be remembered as a dedicated activist for civil and human rights. He championed freedom. In doing so, he fought apartheid—South Africa’s oppressive social system filled with injustice, poverty, and limitations based on race.

The International Civil Rights Center & Museum (ICRCM) in downtown Greensboro, North Carolina, will send condolences to the family of the late President Mandela. Piedmont Triad residents who also wish to send their expressions of sympathy and support to the family may do so at the ICRCM.

The Museum will create a bound volume of the written messages and send them to the Mandela family following funeral services slated for Sunday, December 15.
